We will join historian Kevin J. Tulimieri for a walk-through time. The Lakeview Cemetery in East Hampton was established in 1743, but the distinctive landscape spans millions of years. The tour will include a discussion of the ancient geology, Indigenous history and colonial settlement of East Hampton, and the Connecticut River Valley. Special attention will be given to the creative gravestone carvers and their distinctive 18th and early 19th century artwork that inhabits the cemetery.



Kevin J. Tulimieri is a historian, antiques dealer, and researcher and has been with Nathan Liverant and Son Antiques in Colchester, Connecticut, since 1998. He has a BFA from the Hartford Art School and grew interested in Art History during his studies at the University of Hartford. Kevin enjoys genealogy and exploring the history of the material culture of early America. He has published articles on a variety of American decorative arts in *The Magazine Antiques*, *The New England Antiques Journal*, and *Antiques and Fine Art*. His research on the unique gravestone of the emancipated African American Venture Smith (d.1805) was published in the groundbreaking interdisciplinary textbook *Venture Smith and the Business of Slavery and Freedom*, edited by James B. Stewart with Foreward by James O. Horton.
